TOP 10 TUSSE BETWEEN DJOKOVIC AND TSITSIPAS FOR MADRID CROWN

- The 2019 Mutua Madrid Open will come to a close on Sunday with either World No. 1 **Novak Djokovic** reaching the top of the ATP Masters 1000 title leaders list or World No. 9 **Stefanos Tsitsipas** debuting as an ATP Masters 1000 titlist, as they face off in the final. Djokovic has a 32-15 record in ATP Masters 1000 finals, but Tsitsipas won their only prior meeting, at ATP Masters 1000 Toronto last year.
- Top seed Djokovic is 2-0 in his previous Madrid final showings, defeating **Rafael Nadal** for the 2011 title and **Andy Murray** to triumph in 2016. The world's top-ranked player is into his first ATP Masters 1000 final of the season and just his second final overall this year – but the Serb did capture the Australian Open in his previous 2019 final, claiming his 15th Grand Slam championship. If Djokovic were to win his second title of the year over Tsitsipas on Sunday, he would match Nadal with 33 ATP Masters 1000 titles, putting them tied for first in the list of all-time ATP Masters 1000 champions.
- By contrast, No. 8 seed Tsitsipas is into just his second ATP Masters 1000 final, but the Greek has reached both in style. Last year at ATP Masters 1000 Toronto, Tsitsipas made the final by becoming the youngest player to defeat four Top 10 opponents – including Djokovic – since the ATP Tour was established in 1990. He lost that final to Nadal on his 20th birthday, making him the youngest ATP Masters 1000 finalist since Djokovic himself at 2007 Miami. This week, Tsitsipas made the final with similar flair, ousting No. 4 **Alexander Zverev** in the quarter-finals before claiming his first win in four meetings with No. 2 Nadal in the semi-finals – his first-ever win over a player ranked in the Top 2.
- In the doubles final, 2016 Mutua Madrid Open champions **Jean-Julien Rojer** and **Horia Tecau** are one win away from claiming their second ATP Masters 1000 title as a pairing. To return to the winner's circle in the Spanish capital, Rojer and Tecau will have to defeat **Diego Schwartzman** and **Dominic Thiem**, who have reached two finals in the two events they have played together so far this year. Schwartzman and Thiem were finalists in Schwartzman's hometown of Buenos Aires in February.

- **MAIDEN MASTERS:** Eight players have won their first ATP Masters 1000 title over the last 17 series tournaments: **Alexander Zverev** (2017 Rome), **Grigor Dimitrov** (2017 Cincinnati), **Jack Sock** (2017 Paris), **Juan Martin del Potro** (2018 Indian Wells), **John Isner** (2018 Miami), **Karen Khachanov** (2018 Paris), **Dominic Thiem** (2019 Indian Wells), and **Fabio Fognini** (2019 Monte-Carlo).
 - If **Stefanos Tsitsipas** wins the Mutua Madrid Open title, he will become the ninth player to win his first ATP Masters 1000 title over the last 18 series events.

In the 86 ATP Masters 1000 events prior to 2017 Rome, seven players won their first ATP Masters 1000 title: **Andy Murray** (2008 Cincinnati), **Jo-Wilfried Tsonga** (2008 Paris), **Ivan Ljubicic** (2010 Indian Wells), **Robin Soderling** (2010 Paris), **David Ferrer** (2012 Paris), **Stan Wawrinka** (2014 Monte-Carlo), and **Marin Cilic** (2016 Cincinnati).

During the stretch from 2007 Paris through 2017 Madrid, **Novak Djokovic** (28), **Rafael Nadal** (21), **Andy Murray** (14) and **Roger Federer** (12) combined to capture 75 of the 86 ATP Masters 1000 titles (87.2%).

SUPER SEMI-FINALS FEATURE DJOKOVIC-THIEM, NADAL-TSITSIPAS

- For the first time this season on the ATP Tour there is an all-Top 10 semi-finals as the Top 2 duo of **Novak Djokovic** and **Rafael Nadal** lead the way along with No. 5 **Dominic Thiem** and No. 9 **Stefanos Tsitsipas**. The last time this occurred in Madrid was in 2016 with No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Andy Murray, No. 5 Nadal and No. 6 Kei Nishikori.
- In the first semi-final, **Djokovic** brings a 5-2 head-to-head record against **Thiem** although the Austrian has won the past two meetings at 2017 Roland Garros (QF) and 2018 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo (3R). Djokovic is appearing in his sixth Madrid semi-final (2-3) and when he's won his two previous SFs, the Serb went on to capture the title in 2011 and 2016. Overall this is Djokovic's 64th ATP Masters 1000 semi-final and he's attempting to reach his 48th Masters 1000 final (32-15). This is the third straight year Thiem is in the Madrid semi-finals and the past two years he lost in the final. Thiem is 3-2 lifetime in ATP Masters 1000 semi-finals (1-2 in finals) and he captured the biggest title of his career at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells on 17 March (d. Federer). Thiem, who comes in with an eight-match winning streak, is also playing in the doubles semi-finals (w/Schwartzman) on Saturday
- In the evening semi-final, **Nadal** takes a 3-0 head-to-head advantage (7-0 in sets) against 20-year-old #NextGenATP superstar **Tsitsipas**, who is appearing in his second career ATP Masters 1000 semi-final. Last August in Toronto, the Greek native won his SF against Anderson and then lost to Nadal in the final. Nadal is appearing in his 70th ATP Masters 1000 semi-final and the 32-year-old Mallorca native is trying to reach his 50th Masters 1000 final (33-16). Nadal is 8-2 in Madrid semi-final matches and 5-3 in finals. He only has been broken once this week, holding 26 of 27 service games (96%) while leading the tournament in return games won (40%, 10 of 25). He is looking to capture his first ATP Tour title since last August in Toronto. Nadal is 80-37 in career finals. Tsitsipas leads the ATP Tour with 26 match wins (26-9) and last year he didn't win his 26th match until the 1R in Toronto in August. He is one of four players with an ATP Tour-best two titles this season (Federer, Thiem, Garin).

6 TOP-10 PLAYERS, 7 ATP MASTERS 1000 CHAMPIONS IN MADRID QFS

- **Roger Federer** saved two match points for his 1,200th win on Thursday. The road to No. 1,201 won't be any easier when Federer faces **Dominic Thiem** in the Mutua Madrid Open quarter-finals on Friday. Ninety-three players have met Federer at least five times and only five of them have a winning record against the three-time Madrid champion. Thiem (3-2) is a member of that elite club alongside World No. 1 **Novak Djokovic** (25-22), World No. 2 **Rafael Nadal** (23-15), former World No. 1 **Yevgeny Kafelnikov** (4-2) and former World No. 2 **Alex Corretja** (3-2). Among Thiem's wins over Federer is 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Rome, the last clay-court event played by the Swiss. Thiem also defeated Federer to capture the biggest title of his career at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells on 17 March.
- Nadal is in the Madrid quarter-finals for the 14th time in the last 15 years. That includes one of the Spaniard's five title runs in 2013, when he defeated **Stan Wawrinka** 6-2 6-4 in the final. They meet again on Friday with Wawrinka having held in all 30 of his service games thus far this week. Nadal, however, has dominated his head-to-head rivalry with the Swiss No. 2, sweeping the first 12 matches and 26 sets. Wawrinka rebounded to take three of his next four meetings with Nadal, including a clay win at 2015 Rome. But the Spaniard now leads 17-3 after winning the last four matches and nine sets.
- Djokovic also has 17 wins against his quarter-final opponent. The two-time Madrid champion is 17-2 against **Marin Cilic** after winning the first 14 matches in their head-to-head rivalry. Cilic entered Madrid with a 4-6 record on the season, including four straight losses. He's rebounded with three wins in three sets this week, saving four match points against **Martin Klizan** in his opening match on Monday.
- Each of the Top 4 seeds in Madrid is a former champion, and all four are competing in Friday's quarter-finals. Joining Federer, Nadal and Djokovic is defending champion **Alexander Zverev**, who meets #NextGenATP superstar **Stefanos Tsitsipas**. The 22-year-old German and 20-year-old Greek played twice in a six-day span last August. Zverev defeated Tsitsipas in the Washington semi-finals before squandering two match points against him in the ATP Masters 1000 Toronto quarter-finals.

- **Roger Federer** bids to become the second player in the Open Era to earn 1,200 victories when he meets **Gael Monfils** in the Mutua Madrid Open third round on Thursday. Only **Jimmy Connors** has more wins (1,274) and titles (109) than Federer, who seeks his 102nd championship this week. The three-time Madrid champion is 9-4 overall against Monfils, including a 4-0 mark during the second week of Roland Garros. Though he has not played Monfils in four years, Federer is 12-0 against Frenchmen following his six-month hiatus in 2016, including a win over **Richard Gasquet** on Tuesday.
- Like Federer, World No. 1 **Novak Djokovic** is nearly unbeatable when he faces Frenchmen. Djokovic is 12-0 in matches and 28-0 in sets against **Jeremy Chardy**, whom he meets on Manolo Santana court. Chardy's countrymen don't fare much better. Djokovic is 65-2 against Frenchmen since leading Serbia past France in the 2010 Davis Cup final. That dominance coincides with Djokovic's rise to the top of the ATP Tour. He has finished five of the last eight seasons at No. 1, winning 14 of his 15 Grand Slam and 27 of his 32 ATP Masters 1000 titles, including the Mutua Madrid Open in 2011 and 2016.
- Five-time champion **Rafael Nadal** confronts a rising star for the second straight day in 21-year-old **Frances Tiafoe**. Nadal beat 18-year-old wild card **Felix Auger-Aliassime** on Wednesday to improve to 21-2 against #NextGenATP players since the start of the campaign at 2016 Indian Wells. His only losses were to **Borna Coric** at 2016 Cincinnati and **Denis Shapovalov** at 2017 Montreal. If Tiafoe joins that list on Thursday, he will be the first North American to defeat Nadal on clay. The World No. 2 is 18-0 against North Americans on his favorite surface (14-0 vs. USA, 3-0 vs. CAN, 1-0 vs. CRC).

NADAL VS. #NEXTGENATP, FERRER FACES ZVEREV, DELPO RETURNS

- Five-time champion **Rafael Nadal** faces 18-year-old **Felix Auger-Aliassime** when the second round concludes at the Mutua Madrid Open on Wednesday. Nadal was a teen phenom too once upon a time, winning Roland Garros and six ATP Masters 1000 titles before turning 20. The 32-year-old Spaniard is 20-2 against #NextGenATP players since the campaign launched at 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells. But he's meeting Auger-Aliassime for the first time. Playing at Miami in March, Auger-Aliassime passed Nadal to become the third-youngest ATP Masters 1000 semi-finalist behind **Michael Chang** at 1990 Toronto and **Denis Shapovalov** at 2017 Montreal. On 29 April, the Montreal native passed Nadal again and emerged as the youngest player in the Top 30 since No. 22 **Lleyton Hewitt** in 1999.
- While Nadal remains a title contender at every event he plays, his 37-year-old countryman **David Ferrer** is nearing the end of his career. Set to retire following the Mutua Madrid Open, Ferrer plays in primetime Wednesday against 2018 champion **Alexander Zverev**. They are familiar foes, meeting for the eighth time overall and third time in Ferrer's six tournaments this season. Zverev beat Ferrer at Acapulco on 27 February before losing to him at Miami on 23 March. The third-seeded Zverev is 4-6 in his last 10 matches, losing to **Cristian Garin** last week as the two-time defending champion at Munich.
- Following a first-round bye, **Juan Martin del Potro** meets Rio de Janeiro champion **Laslo Djere** to begin his latest in a long line of comebacks from injuries. The 30-year-old Argentine has played only one other tournament since October, advancing to the quarter-finals of Delray Beach in February. Del Potro fractured his right knee at 2018 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai. He remains ranked in the Top 10 after reaching the Roland Garros semi-finals, Wimbledon quarter-finals and US Open final last season.

37-YEAR-OLDS FEDERER, FERRER AT A CROSSROADS ON MADRID CLAY

- One 37-year-old will compete on clay for the first time in nearly three years. The other will play perhaps the final match of his illustrious career. **Roger Federer** and **David Ferrer** are at a crossroads as they take to Manolo Santana court at the Mutua Madrid Open on Tuesday. Federer's meeting with **Richard Gasquet** marks his first match on clay since 12 May 2016, when he lost to **Dominic Thiem** in the ATP Masters 1000 Rome third round. Ferrer faces fellow Valencia native **Roberto Bautista Agut** in what will be the last of his 1,110 matches if he loses. Bautista Agut, 31, grew up idolizing Ferrer, whom he teamed with for the first time at the 2016 Rio Olympics. Ferrer peaked at No. 3 in the ATP Rankings and spent 292 consecutive weeks in the Top 10 from 2010 through 2016. Bautista Agut hasn't risen as high, but on 12 May, his Ferrer-like streak inside the Top 30 will reach five straight years (260 weeks).
- While playing much of his career in the **Rafael Nadal** era, Federer has managed to put up impressive numbers on clay. The Swiss' .759-win percentage on clay is third-best among active players behind Nadal (.917) and **Novak Djokovic** (.791). His 16 ATP Masters 1000 finals on clay are second only to Nadal's 31. From 2005-09, Federer played 100 clay-court matches. He went 2-9 against Nadal and 84-5 against all other players. A different left-handed Spaniard, new Madrid tournament director **Feliciano Lopez**, capitalized on Federer's absence from 2016 Roland Garros to break his all-time record of 65 straight Grand Slam appearances. Lopez played his 66th Grand Slam in a row at 2018 Wimbledon.

SPANIARDS, #NEXTGENATP PLAYERS KICK OFF CAMPAIGNS ON MONDAY

- Two of the highest-ranked Spaniards will play their opening-round matches on Court Manolo Santana at the Mutua Madrid Open on Monday. Spanish No. 3 **Fernando Verdasco** debuted in the Madrid main draw in the event's second edition in 2003, and he has not missed a main-draw appearance since, with quarter-final showings in 2009 and 2012 as his best results. Verdasco will try to reach the second round for the 13th time when he plays **Radu Albot**. Albot became the first player representing Moldova to win an ATP Tour singles title when he triumphed at Delray Beach earlier this season.
- Spanish No. 4 **Pablo Carreno Busta** joins Verdasco on Court Manolo Santana when he takes on another of 2019's first-time singles champions, **Reilly Opelka**. Carreno Busta is seeking his first match-win since suffering a right shoulder injury in February, which kept him off the tour for ten weeks, as he aims to make the second round at Madrid for just the second time. Big-serving Opelka hit 43 aces in both his semi-final and final victories at the New York Open in February.
- #NextGenATP players **Frances Tiafoe** and **Alejandro Davidovich Fokina** will continue breakthrough seasons as they play their first-round matches on Monday. Tiafoe, who reached his first Grand Slam quarter-final on his 21st birthday at the Australian Open in January, will face No. 14 seed **Nikoloz Basilashvili** in their first meeting. 19-year-old Davidovich Fokina claimed his first Tour-level wins at Estoril last week, going all the way to the semi-finals as a qualifier. The Spaniard will meet veteran **Richard Gasquet**, who is playing his first event of the year as he returns from groin surgery.
- No. 15 seed **Gael Monfils** was also out of action for six weeks after suffering an ankle injury at Indian Wells, but the Frenchman returned last week at Estoril, where he made the quarter-finals before falling to Davidovich Fokina. Monfils will take on **Andreas Seppi** in the first round at Madrid for their seventh meeting at Tour-level; Monfils leads the head-to-head 4-2. Seppi made his first ATP Tour singles final since 2015 at Sydney in January, but the Italian veteran is currently mired in a six-match losing streak.

STATS OF THE DAY

- No. 9 seed **Marin Cilic** and No. 11 seed **Karen Khachanov** will try to end losing streaks on Monday in the first round at Madrid. Cilic, who plays qualifier **Martin Klizan**, has lost four matches in a row dating back to the third round of ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells. Khachanov, who will face Spanish wild card **Jaume Munar**, has lost five straight matches going back to a quarter-final loss to **Rafael Nadal** at Indian Wells.
- Munar has made five ATP Tour quarter-finals this season, the most recent of which came at Marrakech when he defeated then-World No. 3 **Alexander Zverev** in the second round for his first-ever Top 10 win. However, the Spaniard, who turned 22 on Sunday, has yet to win any of his quarter-final matches this year. He lost to the eventual champion twice: **Kevin Anderson** at Pune and **Benoit Paire** at Marrakech.
- Estoril semi-finalist **Alejandro Davidovich Fokina** is the third player this season to earn his first Tour-level win and reach his first semi-final in the same week. He joins **Brayden Schnur**, who went on to finish as runner-up at the New York Open, and **Juan Ignacio Londero**, who went all the way to the Cordoba title.

MUTUA MADRID OPEN STORYLINES

- Star-Studded Field:** 17 of the Top 20 players come to the Spanish capital to play the 2019 Mutua Madrid Open. The Top 4 seeds are all former titlists, as reigning champion **Alexander Zverev** aims to defend his title against former winners **Novak Djokovic**, **Rafael Nadal**, and **Roger Federer**.
- Roger Returns to Clay:** Three-time Madrid champion Federer will play his first match on clay since a third-round loss to **Dominic Thiem** at ATP Masters 1000 Rome on 12 May 2016. Federer is 35-8 in Madrid and his last appearance was in 2015, when he lost to **Nick Kyrgios** in three tiebreak sets in his opening match in the second round. Federer has a 214-68 lifetime win-loss record on clay.
- Rafa Eyes Title:** Nadal has hoisted the Madrid trophy five times, and since Madrid moved to clay in 2009, he is 36-6 at Caja Magica. Nadal still seeks his first title of 2019 after losses to eventual champions **Fabio Fognini** at ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo and Thiem at Barcelona. The last time Nadal came into Madrid without winning Monte-Carlo and/or Barcelona was in 2015.
- Novak Reaches 250:** Djokovic enters Madrid as World No. 1 for the fourth time (2012-13, 2016, 2019), and on Monday will mark the 250th week the 31-year-old Serb is No. 1 in the ATP Rankings. A year ago, he was ranked No. 12 and came in with a 5-5 record after overcoming a right elbow injury. This season, though, he is 15-4, having won a 15th Grand Slam title at the Australian Open.
- Titleholder:** Last year at Madrid, Zverev became the first player to win an ATP Tour clay-court title without getting broken (since service stats started being kept in 1991), facing only one break point in the process. This year, the 22-year-old German comes in with a 13-8 record on the season, and he is 4-6 in his past six tournaments since his best result of 2019, a runner-up finish at Acapulco.
- Back Again: Juan Martin del Potro** is also returning to action after a two-and-a-half-month absence. The Argentine has played only one event in 2019 thus far, a quarter-final run at Delray Beach, before withdrawing from ATP Masters 1000 events at Indian Wells and Miami due to a right knee injury. That injury also kept him out of the Australian Open for the fourth time in five years.
- Ferrer Farewell:** Former World No. 3 **David Ferrer** will play the final event of his storied career this week. The 27-time ATP Tour singles titlist and 2013 Roland Garros finalist will retire after his 16th showing at Madrid. Ferrer made six straight quarterfinals-or-better at the event from 2010 to 2015.
- Going Wild:** Local wild cards **Jaume Munar**, 21, and **Alejandro Davidovich Fokina**, 19, will make their Madrid main draw debuts. Munar is ranked a career-high No. 55, while Davidovich Fokina just had a breakthrough at Estoril, where he beat No. 18 **Gael Monfils** to reach the semi-finals.
- Canadian Clash:** An all-Canadian #NextGenATP encounter will take place in the first round when 18-year-old wild card **Felix Auger-Aliassime** and 20-year-old **Denis Shapovalov** face off for the second time at Tour level. The winner's reward will be a second-round meeting with Nadal.
- Bryans Are Back:** In last year's Madrid doubles final, **Bob** and **Mike Bryan** retired for the first time in 1,407 matches as a team, due to Bob's right hip injury, which required surgery on 2 August 2018. Bob returned to competition in the first week of 2019, and the Bryan Brothers have gotten back to their winning ways since then, claiming titles at ATP Masters 1000 Miami and Delray Beach.
